MED SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

Kaiser Permanente

With an education from the Kaiser Permanente Bernard J. Tyson School of Medicine, you'll begin your career as a community-focused physician with four years of experience as a student in integrated patient care. Before you enroll at the school, you'll need to fulfill certain academic requirements, including prerequisite courses, examinations, and standards for personal abilities.

You must hold a bachelor's degree, in any area of study, from a regionally accredited college or university in the U.S. or Canada.

The Kaiser Permanente Medical School acceptance rate is right around one percent. The average MCAT score is 516. The average GPA is 3.68, and the median GPA is 3.74. No minimum GPA or MCAT scores are required at Kaiser School Of Medicine.

Program

California Institute of Technology: Doctor of Philosophy (MD, PhD)

This program is designed for students interested in pursuing in-depth research to identify and bridge gaps to advance health. Students will typically perform summer research rotations at Caltech before, during, and after the first two years of medical school at the Kaiser Permanente Bernard J. Tyson School of Medicine. Subsequently, they will carry out their doctoral degree work in any of the multiple areas of research offered at Caltech, ranging from bioengineering and biochemistry to computational and neural systems.

Masters Program

A master's degree program typically involves an extra year between the final two years of medical school, with additional part-time commitments in the third and/or fifth year, depending on the program. Students will have ample time to complete their clinical rotations and residency applications. Students must apply for these programs, typically in their second or third year of medical school, and financial aid may be available.

Nursing School: San Diego State University

SDSU's School of Nursing educates and empowers nursing students to advance equitable healthcare and wellbeing in the nursing profession in diverse regional and global communities. Through state-of-art clinical practice and educational experiences we promote transformative healthcare and leadership.







Programs

- Pre-Licensure BS
 - Minimum GPA of 3.0 in A G coursework
 - Minimum grade of B in Intermediate Algebra, Biology, and Chemistry with lab courses. If AP or IB level courses were taken in these areas, applicants must have earned a minimum grade of B.
 - Preference is given to applicants who have taken and earned strong grades in science and mathematics courses.
- RN to BS
 - Minimum GPA of 3.0 GPA
 - Program Duration: 12 to 15 months
 - Approximation Tuition Cost: \$13,000
 - Nursing Course Units: 26 units
 - Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or Diploma from a regionally accredited school
 - Students can start with eligibility for RN licensure pending NCLEX exam.
- Masters Program
 - Applications must be submitted to both SDSU Graduate Admissions and the SDSU School of Nursing.
 - A baccalaureate degree with a major in nursing from a program accredited by the National League for Nursing, Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, or Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing
 - A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in undergraduate upper division courses
 - A California license to practice registered nursing
 - One year of work experience as a registered nurse is preferred prior to starting concentration/ specialization courses.


